


What are Make-Up Days for Emergency Closings?

Make-up Days for Emergency Closings are days that have been built into the school calendar to allow for a fixed graduation date and a more stable end-of-school year date.

For any calendar day marked as a "Make-up Day" (), school is not scheduled to be in session (students and any 10 month employees would not report to school).

However, if any regularly scheduled school day(s) has(ve) been fully cancelled due to an emergency (e.g. weather), then school would be in session on the same number of make-up days as those that had been cancelled and they would be taken in the order listed at the bottom of the calendar.

Therefore, please keep in mind that if the weather is mild and the number of regularly scheduled school days that have to be cancelled due to snow, ice, hurricane, etc... is less than the number of make-up days already built into the school calendar then school would not be in session on any of the remaining, unneeded make-up days.

For Example: On the 2014-15 school calendar, there are 9 days designated as Make-up Days for Emergency Closings to be taken in this order: April 13, 14; May 21, 22, 26; June 18, 19, 22, 23; as well as Spring Break week, but only if on March 1st the number of school days already cancelled has exceeded our 9 designated Make-up Days.

Therefore, if school had to be cancelled on 3 days during the school year, then the first 3 Emergency Make-up Days would need to be used and school would be held on April 13th, 14th, and May 21st, but there would be no school on May 22nd or 26th. Additionally, the last day of school would remain as set for June 17th.

If more than 5 Make-Up Days were needed, then the last day of school would begin moving out by 1 day for each additional Make-Up Day that needed to be used. However, as stated on the calendar, the Graduation Date would remain fixed on June 17th.
