CALL TO ORDER

Jennifer Clark called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

She welcomed new Region 4 BOE members John Stack and Paula Weglarz to the Board and opened the floor for nominations for the position of Board Chair.

On motion duly made and seconded, the Board unanimously VOTED to elect Kate Sandmann to the position of Board Chair for a one year term.

Chair Sandmann opened the floor for nominations for the office of Vice-Chairman.

On motion duly made and seconded, the Board unanimously VOTED to elect Jane Cavanaugh to the position of Board Vice-Chairman for a one year term.

Chair Sandmann opened the floor for nominations for the office of Secretary.

On motion duly made and seconded, the Board unanimously VOTED to elect Rick Daniels to the position of Board Secretary for a one year term.

Chair Sandmann opened the floor for nominations for the office of Treasurer.

On motion duly made and seconded, the Board unanimously VOTED to elect DG Fitton to the position of Board Treasurer for a one year term.

Chair Sandmann took a moment to recognize Jennifer Clark for her leadership as Board Chair over the last 2 years. The Board presented her with flowers and shared refreshments with everyone.

Chair Sandmann asked that Board members send her information on which committees they are interested in serving on for the next year so that she may make appointments accordingly.

CONSENT AGENDA

On motion duly made and seconded, the Board VOTED (7 Y / 0 N / 2 abstain = J. Stack and P. Weglaz = Motion PASSED) to approve the consent agenda consisting of the minutes from the regular meeting of August 26, 2019, the regular meetings of September 05, 2019, and minutes from the workshop of September 25, 2019 and the accounts payable report.

AUDIENCE OF CITIZENS - Approximately 32 citizens were present.

Jim Carey, Essex, congratulated the Board on the special meeting held Monday regarding the Mislick property. He asked that going forward the Board makes sure their law firm knows that the firm's duty is first to the Board itself.

Anne Milley representing the Valley Crew Booster Club, asked that pay be equitable across all sports. She noted that a growing crew team requires a growing coaching staff. She thanked the Board for their support so far.

Mike Hammond, Essex, spoke regarding the on-line courses policy which is on the agenda for a second reading and vote this evening. He asked that they consider clarifying the language regarding the credit guidelines for when on-line courses are used as an alternative education option for expelled or homebound students.

REPORTS AND OTHER ITEMS

Region 4 Student Representatives Report

Middle School Representatives: Ava Frost and Elliot Stack shared an updated on recent events at JWMS including Positive Youth Development Day; athletics; the successful walk-a-thon which raised \$1303 for the Shoreline Soup Kitchen; upcoming musical auditions; an upcoming school dance; and the recent school-wide reading event which culminated with a visit by the author of *Bystander*.

Senior Student Representatives Caroline Baldwin and Evan Benson shared an update on recent events at VRHS including: Spirit Week; a very fun and successful Homecoming Dance; athletics; the upcoming Winter Ball on Dec. 6th; and seniors presenting on their Capstone experiences. They also reported that the guidance department has been very helpful in assisting with college applications.

Other Items

Cynthia Clegg of the Middlesex Community Foundation presented on the newly created Community Fund Education Award for Ivoryton Students. The funds for this have come from the former Ivoryton Congregational Church which closed its doors in June. They contacted Middlesex Community Foundation and asked for guidance in investing a portion of their endowment into the community. There will be both a scholarship fund for Ivoryton students starting in 2020, and a Region 4 fund to provide support for students for cultural events and/or fieldtrips.

Bob Hale, Director of Unified Sports for CAS/CIAC presented Valley Regional High School with a Unified National Champion School Banner recognizing Valley for their work with their Unified Sports program. In particular he noted Valley's whole school engagement and student leadership throughout the school. Valley joins approximately 300 school nationally in receiving this honor.

VRHS Faculty member Laura Hilton presented a request for approval of two trips. 1) Music Dept. trip to New England Music Concert Festival in March 2020 and 2) World Strides Trip to New Orleans in 2021.

On motion duly made and seconded, the Board unanimously to approve the March 2020 Music Dept. trip to the New England Music Concert Festival as presented.

On motion duly made and seconded, the Board unanimously to approve the April 2021 World Strides Music Dept. Trip to New Orleans, as presented, with acknowledgement that the specific dates may be changed as needed, if pending revisions are made to the school calendar prior to the trip.

VRHS Faculty Rachel Rose presented a request for approval of a change of dates for the previously approved Spanish Trip in April 2020. The change of April 3-11th to March 31st – Apr. 8th for the trip is being requested in order to lessen the conflict with Holy Week in Spain, during which time their schools are closed. The date change will increase the educational value for the students by allowing them to visit at a time when they will be able to attend school there, as part of their overall experience.

On motion duly made and seconded, the Board unanimously VOTED to approve the change in dates for the Spanish Trip in April 2020 as presented.

Superintendent's Report

Superintendent White was unable to attend this evening's meeting. His planned report was shared by Assistant Superintendent Kristina Martineau. Dr. Martineau provided the Board with updates on the following:

- O Presented the findings of the independent audit requested by the Board with regards to the Account Payable report for the September 5, 2019 Region 4 Meeting. The Board hired Philip Russell, a retired Business Manager, to independently verify every check reported in the check register for the September meeting. Mr. Russell verified every check, its amount and to whom it was paid. An electronic copy of the report will be shared with the Board.
- Shared information gathered by Supt. White, at the Board's request, regarding the timeline of past and upcoming audits. Superintendent White met with Michael VanDeventner of Mahoney Sabol who committed to bringing the next audit report in front of the Board at their January meeting, as long as the internal prep work is done on time. The business office has already begun assembling and submitting the required internal prep work.
- O Superintendent White has become aware of a corrective action plan filed with OPM to address the weaknesses reported in the 2016-17 audit. He will share regular status updates with the Board.
- Superintendent White and the School Security Advisory Committee will be taking more time to consider the staffing and design scenarios for the proposed JWMS vestibule security project before moving forward a recommendation to the Board.

- Highlighted the quarterly financial report that was shared with the Board. Pointed out a \$119,000 encumbered deficit in the transportation line due to underfunding. Ms. Allen will discuss plans for addressing this.
- o In February of 2019 the district engaged in an energy audit. Superintendent White will provide updates moving forward.
- o Reported on recent communication from CIAC regarding the inadequate status of Valley's field kockey field for any post season play.
- Legal counsel has initiated conversations with the town of Deep River with regards to the outstanding tax issue on the Mislick property. Superintendent White will provide updates.
- o There will be a presentation at the December 5 Joint BOE meeting by our insurance consultant regarding best practices in self-funded plans and building up a reserve.
- An FAQ is being developed for posting on the website in response to the Nov. 4th special meeting regarding the Mislick property.
- o The Region 4 Financial Task Force continues to meet and has a goal to make recommendations to the Region 4 Board at the end of the December Joint BOE meeting.
- Over one hundred parents in total attended the recent PTO meetings held at each of the schools to hear a presentation on A.L.I.C.E. enhanced lockdown training. The Joint Board will see the same presentation and learn more about the future communication timeline at their December meeting.
- Ocommunication regarding the Raptor visitor management system recently installed in schools has gone home to parents and out to vendors. The system will go live on November 18th. All schools except for Deep River Elementary will be using it.
- o Informed the Board per policy #3260 of the intent for JWMS to sell last year's musical set from "Once on This Island" for \$600, an amount determined to be the fair market value. The school intends to use the proceeds from the sale to offset costs for this year's musical set(s).
- Asked the Board if they would like to add a possible VOTE to the agenda to accept a donation from Valley Soccer Club (VSC) in the amount of \$1500.
 - On motion duly made and seconded, the Board unanimously VOTED to add a possible VOTE to accept a donation from (VSC) to the agenda.
 - On motion duly made and seconded, the Board unanimously VOTED to accept a donation from VSC in the amount of \$1500 to be used at the principal's discretion.
- Recognized that there had been a request to discuss International Baccalaureate and Advanced Placement fees for 2020-21 in consideration for budget development and early communication with parents. The Board will re-visit this issue at their January meeting.

Assistant Superintendent's Report

Dr. Martineau reviewed the 2017-18 Performance Profile Reports for JWMS, VRHS and Region 4. She noted that administration will be updating achievement data reporting in the future and will be including achievement growth data. She also noted that administration will be sharing Next Generation Science Standards data at a future Joint BOE meeting once public data becomes available.

Dr. Martineau reported that she and Superintendent White were recently able to follow some IB students through their classes for a day and she was excited to report that the classes are everything that had been hoped for. There are currently seventeen juniors in the cohort and an additional twelve students taking individual IB courses.

Director of Pupil Services Report

Sarah Smalley spoke to the vibrant extracurricular activities offered to all of our students including participation in sports and in the arts, such as the annual musical. She noted that our schools model inclusion in a variety of ways for all students and she thanked her staff for all of their efforts.

Ms. Smalley also reported that flu shot clinics are being run at all of our schools in conjunction with the CT River Area Health District

Financial Status Report

Business Manager Kim Allen reviewed the financial status reports including the cafeteria account and a revenue report for the current fiscal year. She also presented the Board with recommended current year transfer of funds and noted that as a part of the action plan mentioned during the Superintendent's report she will be bringing requests for transfers in front of the Board more often throughout the year. She noted that this evening's transfers are needed because of a deficit in Outside Services due both to under budgeting for a known expense, as well as an additional expense that had not been known during budget development.

On motion duly made and seconded, the Board unanimously VOTED to approve the current year transfer of funds as presented:

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Transfer from 5561 (out of district tuition) to 5119 (para salary) $42,898 Transfer from 5561 (out of district tuition) to 5210 (health insurance) $27,304 Transfer from 5561 (out of district tuition) to 5223 (FICA/Medicare) $2,089
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Ms. Allen also provided an update on facilities projects costs (both budgeted and actual) including the VRHS senior parking lot and curbing repairs at both JW and VR.

Principal Updates

Valley Regional High School Principal Mike Barile shared the Profile of the 2019 graduating class.

Mr. Barile reported that IB has been very positive for students, staff and the entire school population. They will soon begin the recruitment process for next year's cohort. He also discussed Critical and Creative Problem Solving and shared an update on students' assessment which are done three times a year.

Mr. Barile reported that 60% of applicable students have submitted college applications by the November 1st

deadline. He also congratulated Dr. Gbunblee on being a finalist for the 2020 Assistant Principal of the Year. The schools will be hosting a site visit for the that awards committee soon.

<u>John Winthrop Middle School Principal Matt Espinosa</u> reported that they held the faculty/student soccer game earlier today and will be holding a faculty/student volleyball game next week.

Mr. Espinosa discussed professional development held for staff recently regarding tiered instructional differentiation with an aim at reducing the achievement gap. He reported that the entire staff took an SBAC test to better inform their instruction of students for material assessed by that test.

Mr. Espinosa also reported that they continue to work on Critical and Creative Problem Solving at JWMS and are making it more consistent across all classes. He also shared a new direction they are taking at JW which includes self-assessments, and goal setting by students, which will then be shared with parents.

Dr. Martineau shared a report on grant allocations for the past three years for Title I, II, III, and IV Grants which are meant to supplement, <u>not supplant</u> budgets. The Board will be hearing more from administration on this topic as they work to develop budgets that insure we are providing targeted supplemental supports for students.

Dr. Martineau shared a presentation on Student Achievement Assessment Data (see attached).

REPORTS

Committee Reports

Supervision District Committee Update - The Committee met on October 3, 2019.

Joint BOE Ad Hoc School Security Advisory Committee – DG Fitton reported that the Committee met on October 24th and will meet again November 21, 2019. They have added an Early Identification and Intervention subcommittee which also meets monthly and is a very diverse group with a lot of depth in this area. The subcommittee was recently briefed on the current framework already in place at our schools, and he is happy to report that it is a robust and tight framework. Options for the recommended JW vestibule project are being reviewed by the full committee and recommendations for consideration will be brought before the Board during budget development.

A second reading and discussion was held on the following Region 4 Only policy as recommended by the Joint BOE Policy Committee: #6172.6 On-line Courses.

The Board asked that the policy be sent back to the Joint BOE Policy Committee for further revisions and streamlining before they vote on any revisions.

There was time for a discussion of pending Policy #35114 Suspension/Due Process which had a first reading at the Oct. 3rd Joint BOE and will be up for discussion and possible VOTE at the December 05, 2019 Joint BOE meeting.

The Joint BOE Policy Committee will meet again on November 18th. The Joint BOE Finance Committee is scheduled to meet again on November 18th as well, having been moved from Nov. 19th. The Joint BOE Curriculum Committee will meet again on November 18th.

AUDIENCE OF CITIZENS – 5 present

Jim Carey, Essex, commended the board for their recent efforts but asked that the Board request that the law firm take care of resolving the outstanding Deep River property tax issue without further billings because it has been going on for quite some time.

Mike Hammond, Essex also commended the Board but asked that they relook at the information that is contained within the annual Profile of the Graduating Class report as he doesn't think some of the information provided is a useful metric. He wants to make sure the Board also supports students who aren't ready for college yet for a variety of reasons. He voiced his concerns for "kids in the middle".

Richard Strauss, Chester Board of Finance member thanked the board for setting up the R4 Financial Task Force and thinks it is a great collaborative effort. He spoke regarding the projected cafeteria deficit and stressed his concern that he does not believe that number is an accurate portrayal of the cafeteria fund. He also suggested, with regards to future accounts payable reports, the Board consider asking the administration to certify that they've reviewed the AP report and all is in order so that the Board would then merely vote to accept the administration's *certification* of the report, not the report itself, the contents of which are verified as part of the end of year audit process.









Report on the Examination and Verification of the Accounts Payable Report dated 8/14/2019

In September 2019 the Superintendent of Schools for the Regional School District No. 4 covering Chester, Deep River, Essex, and the Region 4 School Districts contacted me. He wanted to procure my services to perform an examination of the Accounts Payable report submitted to the Board of Education and verify that the information is correct.

Scope of Work

The scope of the work to be performed was as follows:

- Review the "Bills for Sanction" a two page summary report dated 8/14/2019 totaling \$1,475,679.07.
- Review the fifty-eight (58) "A/P CASH DISBURSEMENTS JOURNALS" which supports the "Bills for Sanction" above.
- Review and verify that all expenditures listed in the above reports were made and checks were issued to the various listed vendors/staff members.
- Examine all pertinent files in the Business Office, Middle School Office, High School Office, and Facilities Office.
- Verify that all appropriate supporting documents (i.e. Purchase Orders, Reimbursement Claims, Invoices) were on file and accurately reflected the correct amounts to be paid.
- Report findings back to the Superintendent of Schools

My Qualifications

My background includes working in six Connecticut School Districts (26 years as business official), a Connecticut Municipality (5 years as Finance Director) and as Internal Auditor for the State Department of Education (4 years). Since retirement, I have worked as an Interim Business Manager or Consultant for another ten school districts.

Results of Examination

In order to perform an efficient examination of the records, I downloaded all of the electronic records into Excel software and verified that the total of the Cash Disbursements Journals equaled the two page cover sheet presented to the Board of Education.

All records were then separated by source i.e. Central Office (which included Special Education and Sports related expenditures), John Winthrop Middle School, Valley Regional High School, and the Facilities Department. This was done because all records pertaining to each school or department were filed and maintained outside of the Business Office. Each school's or department's records were sorted in alphabetical order to correlate with respective files.

There were 578 payments made broken down as follows:

Central Office	186
John Winthrop Middle School	66
Valley Regional High School	224
Sports related	27
Facilities	75

After reviewing all files, I initially could not find 14 records. After an exhaustive search, however, due to documents getting stuck together or late filing I was able to locate all 578 documents.

I found all of the files in good order with supporting backup. I was able to find a printed check to verify each payment. In addition, all payments were backed up with sufficient documents to support the authorization of the payments.

I would like to thank Cindy Sadlowski at John Winthrop Middle School, Val Owen at Valley Regional High School and Josephine Loschiavo at the Central Office for their help with this endeavor. Also Kim Allen and Jenifer Bryan were helpful as well.

Attached is an eleven page summary of my findings by School/Department of all payments made and confirmed.
